Fred Showker Presents The Holiday Tree Greetings, and Happy Holiday. Print this on your laser printer as a pattern

Transfer to heavy card stock (110 lb. index, etc.) by punching tiny holes through the pattern into the card stock using a straight pin.


Score along the dotted lines with a thin blunt object, like an empty ball-point pen works great!

Carefully cut out along the heavy outside lines of the tree, by connecting the dots (holes) from the straight pin. For best results, use a sharp, new #11 X-Acto blade.

Fold the tree sections up, along the score lines, and glue just the star at the top. Use glue sparingly.

Now glue the card onto a second card which will form the outside "shell." Use glue sparingly so you won't wrinkle the card. A glue-stick works well for this. Try a colored paper for the shell! Paste down the stars (You did save the stars didn't you!) in position in the opening left by the cut-out.

What a nice card to send someone!
